Letter from the Interim Executive Director

Equality Movement is the largest LGBTQ+ community organization in the South Caucasus. The organization was established 12 years ago and has since then strived to build a society in Georgia where people are equal regardless of sex, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, and social class.

Throughout the years, despite encountering numerous obstacles, the organization has been actively engaged in elevating public awareness regarding LGBTQ+ issues. Besides, the organization's efforts extend to initiating and pushing relevant policy changes, providing needbased social, legal, and health services, mobilizing the community, and raising visibility.

The organization's operational focuses can be grouped as follows:

- 1. Advocating and forming an environment for the strengthening of the LGBTQ+ community;
- 2. Ensuring access to healthcare services for LGBTQ+ people and HIV/AIDS prevention;
- 3. Mobilizing, politically empowering, and supporting the integration of the LGBTQ+ community;
- 4. Developing and enhancing the organizational and institutional capacities of the Equality Movement.

In parallel with the escalating intensity of political homophobia in Georgia, in 2023, the Equality Movement implemented its historic highest number of projects. The organization took specific measures for institutional development, the establishment of a secure and healthy working environment, and strategic planning. Moreover, the Equality Movement established new strategic partnerships and built the foundation for innovative interventions and programs to address the needs of the LGBTQ+ community.

Within the reporting period, the Equality Movement conducted two work visits in Brussels, Belgium, to meet representatives of various EU institutions. Moreover, different work meetings and discussions were conducted with representatives of the European Union, EU embassies, and legislative and executive bodies of EU member countries. The Equality Movement was moreover actively involved in national human rights advocacy processes.

In addition to advocacy, coalition, and community-strengthening activities, the organization implemented several collaborative activities in 2023 such as the innovative program 'Selftest Express' with the dating application Grindr. The program allows the users of Grindr to order HIV self-tests, condoms, and lubricants directly within the application. This integrated one-click solution is currently only available in USA, Ireland and Georgia.¹

Furthermore, in the course of 2023, as part of Equality Movement's self-testing program, in seven cities of Georgia, the delivery company Glovo distributed the preventive and harm reduction packages of the organization free of charge. 'COITUS' and 'COITUS Talks' are two additional noteworthy new and successful projects of the Equality Movement and the club TES, which aimed to mobilize the community and promote the organization's preventive services.

Also, in 2023, the Equality Movement joined the UNAIDS campaign 'LET COMMUNITIES LEAD' and held a conference dedicated to World AIDS Day on December 2. The conference consisted of six panels and was attended by members of the LGBTQ+ community, doctors

from the Infectious Diseases, AIDS and Clinical Immunology Research Center, various LGBTQ+ community-based service provider organizations, and local and international partners of the Equality Movement. The representatives shared reports on AIDS-related local and international medical and human rights challenges.

The organization moreover conducted several research projects in 2023. The Equality Movement took a pioneering role in Georgia by being among the first to release a study addressing menstrual poverty and the social impacts related to it.³ Furthermore, the organization carried out two bio-behavioral surveillance surveys: The first was conducted in collaboration with the 'Health Research Union', while the second one, known as BBS-Lite, was a pilot project carried out for the first time in the men-who-have-sex-with-men (MSM) population in Georgia, with the financial support of UNAIDS.

In order to sensitize the environment and foster the political empowerment of the community, the organization conducted thematic community meetings, public lectures, and the educational activities 'Queer Academy' and 'Queer-Feminist Summer Camp'. In addition, during 2023, the organization actively applied to the international human rights protection mechanisms during strategic litigation.

To acknowledge the accomplishments and successful outcomes of the past year, I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the outstanding team of the organization, valuable strategic partners, and supporters. Thank you for your tireless work, dedication, and commitment to our common values!

Reports of 2023

- 1. Submission to the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) Within the reporting period, Equality Movement submitted a joint report with the Eurasian Coalition for Health, Rights, Gender and Sexual Diversity (ECOM) and the Queer Association Temida. The report addressed human rights violations of LBTQ+ women. Equality Movement represented the main findings of the report during the 84th session of the Committee.
- 2. **ILGA-Europe Annual Report -** Equality Movement submitted inputs for ILGA-Europe's annual report.
- 3. The Right to Non-discrimination in Practice for Various Groups in Georgia Within the reporting period Equality Movement, as a member of the Coalition for Equality, prepared a chapter on the human rights violation of the LGBTQ+ community in 2022.
- 4. Report on Hate Crimes Within the reporting period, the civil society platform No-to-Phobia started working on a report on hate crimes. The report discusses the state's practices and general policies against hate crimes. The Equality Movement covered sexual orientation-, gender identity-, and gender expression- (SOGIGE) motivated hate crimes.
- 5. OSCE/ODIHR Hate Crimes Data In April 2023, Equality Movement submitted all its documented cases of SOGIGE-motivated hate crimes to OSCE/ODIHR.

Description of the Project Activities and Indicators	In the framework of the project, a total of 5,471 people received either HIV self-tests or HIV prevention packages (condoms and lubricants) via the platform www.selftest.ge and delivered free of charge by Glovo. In addition, a total of 3,106 HIV tests, 48,905 condoms, and 8,841 lubricants were distributed.
	During the project, Equality Movement has produced 6 animations, 8 digital banners, and informational materials about HIV self-testing. In addition, a community meeting was organized in the framework of the collaborative activity 'COITUS Talks' of the Equality Movement and the club TES.
	In 2023 the platform <u>www.selftest.ge</u> was improved. The major updates can be grouped as follows:
	 The users of the website can report the result of their HIV self-test by uploading a photo of the result on the website. In exchange, they receive a voucher to top-up their phone balance;
	 Equality Movement and the dating application Grindr have expanded their partnership. Now the users of the application can order HIV prevention packages for free and anonymously without even leaving the application. To make the order, they only have to go to the side menu of the application, choose "Free HIV Home Test", and fill out the requested information;
	 The fourth community-based HIV-test provider organization Queer Association - Temida, which offers free HIV prevention packages named as T-Pack to Trans* community, has joined <u>www.selftest.ge</u>.
	Moreover, EM has organized an AIDS conference on December 2nd. It consisted of six panels and was attended by members of the LGBTQ+ community, doctors from the Infectious Diseases, AIDS, and Clinical Immunology Research Center, as well as community-based, service providers, and LGBTQ+ organizations. Attendees also included strategic partners of the Equality Movement, representatives from local and international non-governmental organizations, and state institutions. The representatives shared reports on AIDS-related challenges in Georgia

and the region, as well as ongoing obstacles and the intersections between the AIDS epidemic and homophobia.

The project achievements can be measured by the following two indicators: 1. Beneficiaries who received a basic preventive package (condoms, lubricants, sexually transmitted diseases preventive information materials) – 100 (indicator exceeded by 54%). 2. Beneficiaries who received voluntary counseling and testing (VCT) for HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases (infections) - 89 (indicator fulfilled by 99%). In the framework of the project 5 informative/educational meetings have been held. Three of them have been conducted in Tbilisi and two of them in Batumi. In total the meetings have been attended by 58 people. In addition, a total of 83 psychological consultancies have been provided to members of the trans* community. Moreover, two types of thematic information brochures have been prepared: 1. "What we should know about sexually transmitted diseases?"; 2. "Legal gender recognition and trans-specific services"

In Tbilisi, the interviews have been carried out by the Equality Movement, and in Batumi and Kutaisi by Identoba. A total of 150 beneficiaries took part in the study. In the framework of the project a total of 215 beneficiaries received a Chemsex Kit.
On June 23, a training for peer educators was held at the office of Equality Movement. The training agenda covered the issues of post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), chemsex practices, psychoactive substances, and harm reduction. In the framework of the training issues such as the active use of the psychoactive substances like GHB and GBL, and risks associated with their usage in a sexual context were discussed.
Several information materials related to safe sex practices and the use of psychoactive substances were developed:
 The Chemsex Brochure provides general recommendations related to practices of chemsex and the use of psychoactive substances. The Safe Sex Guide consists of brief recommendations/reminders on how to avoid risky behaviors in the club; Reminders (Posters) represent advice regarding the use of psychoactive substances.

9. Improving HRs⁴ of LGBT people in Georgia

Description of the Project Activities and Indicators	Services: In the framework of the project Equality Movement provided the following services: • Service of social workers: 329 LGBTQ+ people received the service. • Service of Lawyers: 149 new cases were accepted and managed by the lawyers of the organization. In total, Equality Movement is managing 200 ongoing current cases. • Service of Psychologists: 84 LGBTQ+ people received the services. In total, 786 sessions were conducted. • Service of Psychiatrists: 98 LGBTQ+ people received the services. In total, 294 consultations were conducted.
	Queer Academy: The main aim of the Queer Academy is political empowerment of the LGBTQ+ community members. In 2023, the second Queer Academy with the name "Empires and Queer Movement" took place. The main objective of this year's academy was the creation of a space to discuss postcolonial and decolonial theories and highlight the relevance of the theories to Georgian reality as well as to the agenda of the local queer movement. In total, 17 participants attended the academy and 10 meetings were organized. 3 meetings were designated for lectures, 4 for panel discussions, one was used for the screening of the movie "Self-Portrait Along the Borderline" and its discussion with the director Anna Dzaipshipa. The activity concluded with the workshop "In Search for Alternatives".
	Queer-Feminist Summer School This year's Queer-Feminist Summer School was organized in cooperation with the Women's Initiative Supporting Group (WISG). The main aim of the activity was to raise awareness of youth on queer and feminist theories as well as on sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR). The target audience of the project was LGBTQ+ community members aged 18-30, who did not have any previous experience in activism and/or in cooperation with LGBTQ+ community organizations. The summer school consisted of two parts: The first part of the school was designated to discuss the development of queer-feminist theories in the West as well as in Georgia. The second part was focused on the theoretical and practical basis of SRHR and its connection with feminist and queer theory.

About 60 persons applied for participation in the project. Based on the applications, the selection committee selected 20 persons. As a result of the project, 19 young activists attended five-day training sessions...

Queer-Feminist Summer School Alumni Meeting

Equality Movement organized a meeting for the Alumni of the Queer-Feminist Summer Schools of 2022 and 2023. The main objectives of the meeting were the creation of an alumni network, the evaluation of the project by the participants, and the discussion of the plans. In total, 30 Alumni and 6 trainers attended the meeting. The participants highlighted the following topics as project results:

- Raised awareness of queer and feminist issues, and individual and political empowerment;
- Re-evaluation of existing knowledge which led to increased empathy towards various groups and individuals;
- Increased feeling of self-affiliation with the LGBTQ+ community, getting to know queer organizations, and engaging in their activities;
- Increased access to safe spaces.

Additionally, the majority of the summer school participants got engaged in queer grassroot activism as a result of the project. A number of initiative groups have been established. The projects and activities conducted by the groups and individuals included, but were not limited to organizing meetings at schools and universities concerning gender equality, homo/transphobic attitudes, and SRHR.

Strategic Litigation

On September 8, 2023, the organization filed a lawsuit to the European Court of Human Rights. The case of I.A. was managed by Tamar Zarqua, lawyer of Equality Movement, from November 2021. Throughout 2023, the organization exhausted the domestic remedies and addressed the issue to the European Court of Human Rights. The plaintiff, represented by the Equality Movement, lodged a complaint against the Georgian state concerning the alleged violation of Articles 3 and 14 of the European Convention on Human Rights. Specifically, the case contests allegations of inhuman or degrading treatment predicated upon the grounds of sexual orientation attributed to the actions of the state.

The European Court of Human Rights accepted the proceedings and extended an invitation for a "friendly settlement" to the plaintiff and the state. Pursuant to the settlement offer, the state is obligated to remit a compensation of 15,000 Euros for the redress of damages.

	The political instrumentalization of homophobia is one of the most important reasons for the vulnerability and insecurity of the LGBTQ+ community in Georgia. Members and activists of the LGBTQ+ community not only personally face negative, often hostile attitudes based on prejudices and stereotypes, but also have to support and empower other members of the LGBTQ+ community, sharing their needs and concerns. Living and working in such conditions leads to emotional burnout related to stressful factors. In order to develop the stress-resilience skills of members of the LGBTQ+ community Equality Movement held 2 training sessions for LGBTQ+ activists in July and September. The trainer discussed with the LGBTQ+ activists the challenges and defined strategies for developing stress resilience. A total of 30 people participated in the training sessions.

Community meeting on LGBTQ+ community positioning and strategic communication

On December 14, the Equality Movement held a community meeting to discuss the issues of strategic communications and positioning of the LGBTQ+ community. 20 activists attended the meeting and mapped the topics that should be included in the communication strategy of the Equality Movement.

Cooperation with LGBTQ+ community organizations

During the reporting period, the Equality Movement participated in four meetings together with LGBTQ+ community organizations.

- The first meeting was held on February 14. Representatives of the Women's Initiatives Support Group (WISG), the Queer Association Temida, Peripheria and Identoba Youth discussed acute issues that affected the LGBTQ+ community members.
- The second meeting was held on March 11-12, in the city of Kutaisi, where the platform member organizations attended the conference "Hidden Feelings and Feminist Imagination in the Periphery" organized by Peripheria.
- At the May 3 meeting, the current events related to the so-called "Russian Law" and possible directions for further development of the government's political homophobia were discussed.
- The last meeting in the reporting period was held on June 29. The
 topic was the upcoming Tbilisi Pride, with a special emphasis on
 the safety issues of LGBTQ+ community members, and the
 organization's contribution through psycho-social and legal
 services.
